<b>Caroline T. Clough</b>	9 Aug. 1812 - 29 Mrz. 1883	70 Jahre verheiratet mit einem Methodisten-Prediger
<b>Harriet McCann</b>	1814 - 21 Jan. 1876	61 Jahre heiratete einen Prediger
<b>John B. Harmon</b>	29 Dez. 1815 - 6 Mrz. 1883	67 Jahre Geschäftsmann
<b>Mary Plummer Foss</b>	21 Jul. 1821 - 22 Mai 1912	90 Jahre verheiratet mit Samuel Foss, Bruder von Hazen Foss
<b>Sarah B. Belden</b>	13 Feb. 1822 - 25 Nov. 1868	46 Jahre heiratete Stephen T. Belden. Die Trauung führte James S. White durch. Ihr Sohn Franklin Edson Belden (*1858) schrieb 600 bis 800 geistliche Lieder. Sarah verstarb an Tuberkulose.
<b>Robert Harmon Jr.</b>	13 Jul. 1825 - 5 Feb. 1853	27 Jahre Tuberkulose; wurde Siebenten-Tags-Adventist kurz vor seinem Tod
<b>Ellen Gould White</b>	26 Nov. 1827 - 16. Jul. 1915	87 Jahre
<b>Elizabeth N. Bangs</b>	26 Nov. 1827 - 21 Dez. 1891	64 Jahre kurz „Lizzie“, heiratete einen Krämer/Lebensmittelhändler Die Familie wurde kurz vor Lizzies Tauftermin von der Methodistenkirche ausgeschlossen. Lizzie schloss sich keiner anderen Kirche an.

Zusammenfassung: Drei Töchter heirateten einen Prediger.  
 Die Eltern (Robert und Eunice), 3 Töchter (Mary?, Sarah und Ellen)  
 sowie ein Sohn (Robert) wurden Siebenten-Tags-Adventisten.
